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Case Summary

I was notified by phone, from elder in the Followers of Christ Church of a death of a church member. When I arrived at the residence I found the deceased to be a 22 month old male child. He was lying across his mother's lap, next to the father, with several members of the church present. The child was pale and he had been bathed and dresses and according to the church tenants, they had prayed over his body for at least an hour. I spoke with the parents who told me that the child had been suffering from a fever for several days and that they thought he had been teething. He was cranky, and chewing on his fingers a lot. He had also had a slight, unproductive cough and the past day he had had a rattle in his chest and he had coughed up a small amount of phlegm. He was not a very mobile child and had just begun to start toddling around. On exam I found him to have the characteristics of a Down's syndrome child with the facial features of a Down's child. This would explain his slow progress in walking. There were no signs of trauma. Removal was made by Dakans.
